

Biggs Fire Department

Report on Conditions

August 2010

During August the fire department responded twenty four (24) calls for service locally. There were nine (9) calls within the City limits. Fifteen (15) calls were in the County area where our fire engine arrives first.

In June the Butte County Board of Supervisors approved additional funding of the County Fire Department for this fiscal year. A fire department plan to maximize the Board's additional funding was implemented in July. During August it was necessary to serve one last "Brownout" date scheduled for our Biggs fire engine.

The plan is to avoid brownout of all fire engines while remaining within budgeted funding.

During August fire personnel were able to complete some fire hydrant maintenance, at least until a large grant funded safety gear shipment arrived. The Biggs fire station serves as the warehouse for safety gear for regional fire service. Grant funding to Butte County has provided hundreds of thousands of dollars of safety gear for our forces. Much of our firefighter's available time in August was spent warehousing the new gear.

In August Sunwest Mill's wild rice processing began. Improved processes over last year seem to have reduced risk of fire. Although not greatly damaging, last year the mill had a fire problem in this process.
