SUBJECT: NCPA Electric Public Benefits Participation

Council is being asked to consider the level of Biggs's participation with the NCPA Public Benefits Committee and direct staff.

Background

California law mandates that publicly owned utilities (POU's) collect a separate surcharge to be used for "public benefits" programs in four categories: (1) Cost-effective demand-side management services to promote energy efficiency and energy conservation; (2) New investments in renewable energy technology; (3) Research, development and demonstration; and (4) Services provided to low income electricity customers. The amount POU's must collect is 2.85% of electric revenues, which the City collects on a monthly Consolidated Utility Bill.

Each year, the city must provide to the state a Draft Public Benefits Budget and Energy Efficiency (EE) Rebate Program based on expected electric revenues, analysis of past programs and periodic forecasts of future performance.

The NCPA Public Benefits Committee was formed so that members could share information and pool resources in their compliance efforts. Also seeking efficiencies, NCPA coordinates efforts in this area with CMUA (California Municipal Utilities Association) and the SCPPA (Southern California Public Power Authority).

The state's regulatory environment in this area changes rapidly. For example, the NCPA Public Benefits Committee was asked by the Utility Directors to meet in December 2012 (in between the usual bi-monthly meetings) to assist in digesting the potential ramifications of Prop 39.

At the Utility Directors meeting in February, the Utility Directors supported NCPA's suggestion that the Public Benefits Committee return to meeting monthly for perhaps the next 6 months to work through a variety of current and formulating state actions such as potential residential and commercial electric vehicle charging station legislation; on-bill energy retrofit financing arrangements; whole building energy efficiency programs, among others.

Aside from the NCPA Public Benefits MOU which states that the Public Benefits Committee will meet "...once every other month, or more frequently as determined by the Utility Directors or equivalent", I came to understand that Biggs has a resolution limiting participation in the Public Benefits Group to an average of four (4) hours per month. The recent uptick in Public Benefits activity has put us over that average, and moving forward staff requests guidance regarding Biggs' level of participation with the NCPA Public Benefits Committee.


Recommendation:

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN

MEMBERS OF THE NORTHERN CALIFORNIA POWER AGENCY

REGARDING PUBLIC BENEFITS PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS

This **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING** (the "MOU") dated _____, 2012 is intended to document the intentions of the following **MEMBERS OF THE NORTHERN CALIFORNIA POWER AGENCY ("NCPA")** and to provide a framework for the signatory NCPA Members to work together in collaboration on projects related to the Public Benefits Programs or Public Benefits Projects established by Members that are subject to California Public Utilities Code Section 385.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE MEMBERS THAT ARE SIGNATORIES HERETO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

I. Establishment of Public Benefits Advisory Group.

Members agree to establish, amongst themselves, a staff level technical committee of Member representatives as a Public Benefits Advisory Group. It will meet in Roseville at NCPA once every other month, or more frequently as determined by the Utility Directors or equivalent.

II. Purpose of Public Benefits Advisory Group.

The purpose of the Public Benefits Advisory Group shall be to provide advice and guidance to Utility Directors to facilitate cooperation, coordination with NCPA, and exchange of information in connection with the various matters which may arise from time to time in connection with the Public Benefits Programs or Public Benefits Projects established by Members that are subject to California Public Utilities Code Section 385.

III. Appointment to Public Benefits Advisory Group.

Each Member's Utility Director or equivalent is entitled to appoint one (1) Member staff person to serve as a representative to the Public Benefits Advisory Group.

IV. Public Benefits Advisory Group Responsibilities.

The Public Benefits Advisory Group shall have the following responsibilities related to Member Public Benefits Programs:

- A. Review and make recommendations to Utility Directors concerning methods for sharing best practices related to and among Members by:
 - 1. realizing economies of scale for Member communities through joint project collaboration;
 - 2. providing technical guidance to Members that may be interested in deploying similar programs within their respective utility service territory; and
 - 3. developing a better understanding of cutting edge technologies and new programs.
- B. Work collaboratively to respond to legislative and regulatory mandates to provide data and formal reports related to energy efficiency, renewable resources, renewable resources, research and development, and low income assistance; and
- C. Perform such other advisory functions and duties as directed by Utility Directors.

V. Public Benefits Project Recommendations.

The Public Benefits Advisory Group may also recommend that Members participate in specific projects undertaken pursuant to Section 385 of the California Public Utilities Code. Each such project shall be undertaken only after approval of a formal L&R member services agreement with NCPA by which the participating Members agree to pay for the costs of such project.

VI. Effective Date.

This MOU shall take effect with respect to that Member upon that Member's signature of the MOU.

VII. Member Obligations.

Each Member shall be responsible for the acts and omissions of its Public Benefits Advisory Group Representative.

VIII. Integration; Modification.

This MOU incorporates the entire understanding and agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior understandings and agreements between the parties, whether oral or written, with respect to the subject matter hereof. To be effective, an amendment, waiver or termination of this MOU must be in a document signed by an authorized officer of each party.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, Members have executed this MOU on the dates set forth below. By their signatures below, each signatory represents that he/she has the authority to execute this agreement and to bind the party on whose behalf his/her execution is made.

SUBJECT: City Participation in NCPA Public Benefits Committee (Discussion/Action)

Council is asked to consider adopting a local resolution and authorizing city administrator to sign a related NCPA memorandum of understanding.

Background:

As State requirements and regulations have evolved for energy efficiency, NCPA member agencies have found it helpful to collaborate to better understand and coordinate approaches to reporting and emerging technologies. The resulting effort has become known as the Public Benefits Committee, although until recently it has not been formally established nor provided authority nor boundaries.

NCPA staff, in consultation with the committee and agency utility directors (UD's), has developed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) for signature by UD's, which has received broad support across the agency. There is an opportunity for Biggs to participate while still retaining its autonomy by locally defining its participation and Public Benefits program approach.

The electric commissioner (Mayor Frith), city administrator and city attorney have drafted resolution language intended to establish and convey the City's internal expectations for participation in the Public Benefits Committee, as well as to clarify to staff Council direction for reporting on energy efficiency programs.

RESOLUTION NO. 2012-02

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BIGGS
AFFIRMING AND DEFINING THE CITY'S PARTICIPATION
IN THE NCPA PUBLIC BENEFITS COMMITTEE**

WHEREAS: NCPA members have found it helpful to collaborate on sharing of technology and reporting requirements related to the Public Benefits and other energy efficiency programs and projects; and

WHEREAS: The Public Benefits Committee (PBC) is established by MOU to facilitate and provide boundaries for this collaborative effort; and

WHEREAS: Biggs desires to continue to participate in the PBC to the extent it aids Biggs staff in their responsibilities, facilitates carrying out of city objectives and directives as set forth by the city council, and does not add cost or other obligatory burden to the city; and

WHEREAS: The city council desires to be informed and retain local control of energy efficiency efforts and programs;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Biggs, that approval of the NCPA PBC MOU is dependent upon and supported by the following local understanding for the benefit of effective internal staff and council use:

1. Staff participation in PBC activities is limited to an average of four (4) hours per month, acknowledging that this may include full-day out-of-town meetings every other month, telephone conference calls, research activities, and collaboration with other agencies. Exceedance of four hours requires reporting to city council and, if practical, prior approval of the city council.
2. Staff, through the city administrator, will provide to council a concise written report of PBC participation, activities and budget changes at least quarterly.
3. Any obligations on the city such as rebate rates to be paid, purchases over \$500 to be made from PB funds, and NCPA projects in which to participate, will be brought to the council via the City Administrator/UD and/or electric commissioner for direction in advance of any commitment or indication to NCPA of city interest.
