**PROCLAMTION “PROCLAIMING APRIL 2018 AS
CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH”**

Whereas, National Child Abuse Prevention Month will be recognized throughout the United States, as well as in the great state of California during the month of April 2018; and

Whereas, preventing child abuse and neglect is a community problem that depends on “Strong Communities that Strengthen Families; and

Whereas, child maltreatment occurs when people find themselves in stressful situations, without community resources and don’t know how to cope; and

Whereas, child abuse and neglect can be reduced by making sure each family has the support they need to raise their children in a healthy environment; and

Whereas, child abuse is considered to be one of our nation’s most serious public health problems with scientific studies documenting the link between the abuse and neglect of children and a wide range of medical, emotional, psychological and behavioral disorders; and

Whereas, effective child abuse prevention programs succeed because of partnerships created among state and local government agencies, schools, faith communities, civic organizations, law enforcement and the business community
