New After-Hours Payment Drop



The City has installed a new, secure payment drop box to the right of the office door at City Hall, 465 C Street. This drop is for checks, money orders and cashier's checks. We ask that you not drop cash payments. The box will be checked daily Monday thru Friday.

City Marijuana Rules

The City of Biggs has strict regulations regarding "medical marijuana" cultivation. Growing can only occur in a secure, alarm-protected, detached structure. The size of the grow area is limited, and in no case can it be less than 500' from a school or church. **More details are in the code text which can be found on the city website or by contacting City Hall.**



The city's ordinance is designed to permit the exercise of whatever legal rights might exist, while protecting neighbors from the nuisance of the smell and sight of marijuana – which tends to attract criminal activity to neighborhoods. Fines for code violations are heavy and can also be found in the city code.
